Condition categories

Condition categories are used by archaeologists to explain the preservation of a site.

Condition examples

Good condition

Fully or almost-fully intact and clear at time of survey.

Fair condition

Structurally recognisable, but subject to some damage or decay or alterations.

Poor condition

Generally poor condition, significant features largely missing.



Very poor condition

Substantially collapsed or features wholly missing.

Converted and restored

Sometimes, buildings are no longer used for their original wartime purpose (converted) or have been significantly changed (restored). Click the 'converted' or 'restored' boxes to record changes to the building.



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
