2 Little Cloister @Gloucester Cathedral

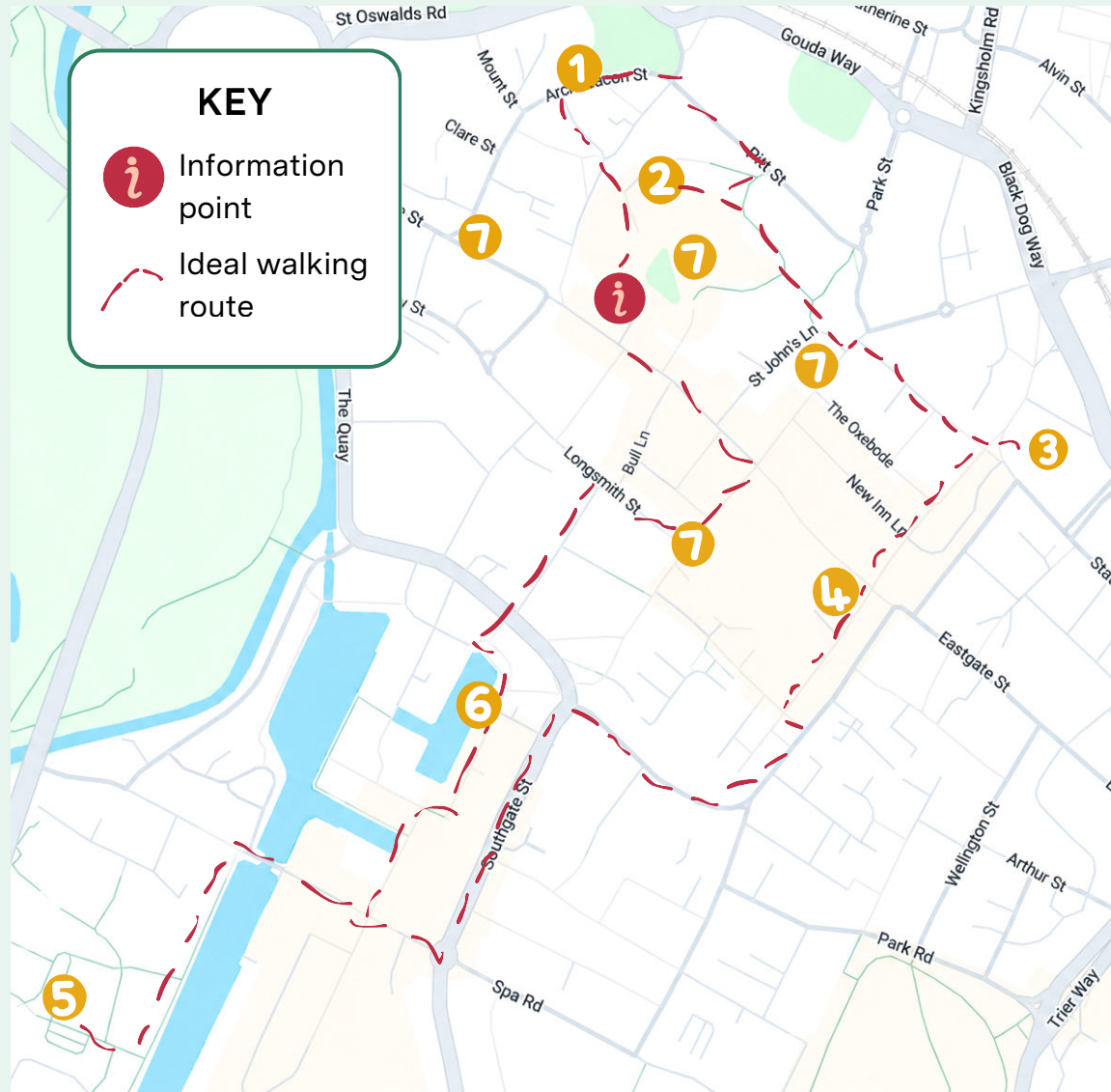
Rosemary has been used since the Roman times for perfume and other uses. Medieval people thought it would stop sickness
